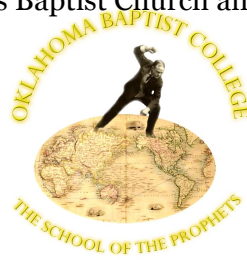

From Brother Legere

Dear Alumni:

I have the privilege this month to write to you concerning what is going on at your alma mater.

We had a good semester with all but one enduring till the end. We are hoping to have a few new students attend in the spring semester, but we will have to wait to see. The goal for this coming fall will be to have over 100. Would you pray daily for us to see this increase in our enrollment?

The Christmas Banquet was at The Biltmore Hotel this year. We enjoyed a wonderful evening of fellowship and had some students and alumni give testimonies. Mrs. Crystal Ager gave a soul-stirring testimony before her husband, Bro John Ager gave the message. The Lord used his message to touch many of those who attended. Bro. and Mrs. Ager are helping the Ridges at Victory Baptist Church in Yukon.

We are starting a new class this semester. Bro. Van Manen will be teaching International Phonics which will be an introductory course that will assist our Missions Department in Linguistics. We will still encourage our graduating missionaries to attend Baptist Bible Translators Institute when they start their deputation. We are excited about this new class as it opens up a different level of training. It will help greatly in the area of language school and translating the Bible into tribal languages.

We have had a few construction jobs at Windsor Hills over the Christmas break. Bro. Keeton has taken the print shop offices and cleaned them up, built and painted a few walls, and laid carpet for the new Youth

Center. Through donations and a few purchases of their own, they have 2 Air Hockey tables, 2 Foosball tables, and have set up a Wii corner. The new Youth Center is geared for the teens but they have graciously invited the college kids to have access to it in the evenings. We foresee many hours of enjoyment with the odd event of what we could call a "learning experience." We have also put some time in to continuing the updating of the Education Wing. The Men's bathroom needed a new floor, so a couple of men donated their time and re-tiled and painted. We were able to replace the commodes all for under \$125.

We are also working towards a bigger construction project over the next few years. We are hoping to remodel the remainder of the print shop into a Library. The plans will be ready by the end of the year. Would you pray daily for us also concerning this project? The cost will be small for what we will benefit, but the Lord needs to work on our behalf to see it accomplished. We are not going to ask you for money, but we do covet your prayers.

This year's graduating class will be 15. We have students going into teaching, secretary, Pastorate and Missions. We will have 14 young people coming to our Candidate School in May. We will have couples planning on going to Israel, the Amazon, the Chinese, the Czech Republic, and a few undecided but know they are called to missions. The Lord is still moving in our generation and we are honored to have a small work in His Field.

He Counted Me Faithful

Dear Alumni,

When Brother Finn asked me to write an article for the Scroll of the Prophets, I was humbled by the opportunity but did not know what to write about at first. When I have read other alumnus' articles, they were usually written by missionaries on deputation or furlough. My first thought was that I did not have the experience that they did. Then, I realized that I could share how good God has been to me.

A verse that has been a blessing to me this past year is Psalms 90:17, “**And let the beauty of the LORD our God be upon us: and establish thou the work of our hands upon us; yea, the work of our hands establish thou it.**” In spite of my short-comings and faults, I am grateful to have that beauty upon my life according to His mercy and grace. Reading that verse, once again, I was reminded that I could not do anything without Him because He is the One Who “establishes the work of our hands”. When I think about that, I am humbled by this privilege I have as a Christian. As I pondered upon this verse, three different areas have come to my mind where God has shown me that beauty.

First, I see that beauty in my personal life. I was born in Korea. While growing up, I went to church with my family from time to time. When I was sixteen, God led me to America for further education. My plan was to go to high school and an university here, so that I would have better job opportunities. God convicted my heart about my need of salvation. I realized that I had a head knowledge but not a heart knowledge. I asked God to save me on January 31, 2002. That summer, I went to the Youth Conference at Windsor Hills Baptist Church and surrendered to be a missionary. Praying about where God wanted me to go for further training, He led me to Oklahoma Baptist College. When I first came to college, I did not know anything about walking with God. Having listened to different preaching in chapel and church services, I have learned the importance of it. I can surely testify that it changed my life. Since graduating in 2007, I have been serving here at Windsor Hills Baptist Church as a dorm supervisor and a church secretary. I wear many hats around here such as Yearbook Adviser, ASL signer, and a member of the Deaf Choir. I have also had the



privilege of traveling with different singing groups. It has been a blessing to have a little part in this ministry. I am grateful for God's leading in my life; He has always provided and taken care of me. God is so wonderful, and I am thankful that He allows me to serve Him. It is my daily challenge that I would show His beauty upon my life to others, and that I will not be a hindrance of reflecting that beauty.

Secondly, I see that beauty in the lives of the faithful staff and faculty. I know each of you can testify to the same thing in your life regarding the staff and faculty at Oklahoma Baptist College. It has been such a blessing to serve the Lord with faithful servants of God. All of them live what they teach or preach. They have always been there for me to talk to or to

give me godly advice. Their testimony of faithfulness have been a real encouragement to me. It is my honor to be under their influence every day.

Thirdly, I see that beauty in the spiritual growth of the Oklahoma Baptist College students. It has been a blessing to see students making various decisions such as becoming saved, rededicating, or surrendering their lives. I am so thankful that I have a chance to have a little part in their lives. My part might be insignificant, but praise the Lord for what He does through us.

Alumni, starting a New Year, I pray all of you would experience or be reminded of His beauty in your life. You are an encouragement to me as you have set a godly example by being faithful to His call in your life. I am thankful for all of you. Have a wonderful year!
